








Select your student from the "Student List".



 Selecting a student will take you to the Navigation screen. This screen allows you to select from the available modules.









Chronic absenteeism hurts students in a variety of ways as they progress through their school career, starting with kindergarten.








iReady -Reading and Math

- All students take reading and math diagnostic tests 3x per year (now, winter, and spring).
- Reports from this are used to:
 - Identify strengths and areas for growth for each student
 - Determine each student's rate of growth to make instructional decisions.
 - Identify students who need extra support (this shows up as "Academic Support" per. 8 on schedules)
