

Community Curriculum Advisory Committee

The Board recognizes the importance of community involvement in District curriculum. The Community Curriculum Advisory Committee (CCAC) will review any topics assigned by the Board and assist in the development of the schools' curriculum and instructional programs.

The committee will be comprised of a minimum of 5 participants. This number can be expanded as deemed necessary. The committee shall include student representation, as appropriate. Committee members will be appointed by the Board. All members of the committee must be community members living within the District attendance area.

The length of term shall be two years:

1. The terms are September, year one, through June, year two.
2. Incoming representatives shall be approved by the Board at the September regular session or as openings occur.

In June, the Board will identify vacant CCAC positions, which must be filled by appointment of the Board. The Board will announce the vacancies and receive applications from interested persons during the summer. Such applications will include a signed statement that the applicant is willing to serve as a member of the CCAC and to adhere to the policies of the District. The Board may appoint CCAC members to as many consecutive terms as deemed appropriate.

In September, the Board will review the names of persons filing applications and names of those persons who have served previously and are applying for reappointment. At the first regular meeting in September, the Board will appoint persons to fill the vacant positions.

3. Resignations from the committee will be accepted by the Board. Replacement representatives shall be approved by the Board to fill the unexpired terms.

The purpose of the committee is to review areas that have been identified by the Board and other curricular areas:

1. To serve as a resource to the Board, the Superintendent, and other district office staff in setting direction for long-range curriculum development;
2. To review and give input on recommendations from the staff curriculum committees as needed;
3. To review textbook adoption recommendations and other programs.

The purpose of the committee is advisory in nature. The committee reports findings and recommendations to the Board for discussion and action.
