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




### CLASS SIZE

ON-TIME GRADUATION Students earning a diploma within four years. Cohort includes students who were first-time




### School Goals




### **State Goals**


### **ON-TRACK TO GRADUATE**



## About Our School

### ADVANCED COURSEWORK

Our school offers many dual credit, AP and Honors courses for our students in grades 9-12.

AP courses- Calculus, Biology, Environmental Science, Human Geography, Economics, Government, English Literature, and Psychology Honors- English 9, 10, and 12. Dual Credit- Agricultural Technology, Animal Science, Design Seminar, Film & Video, Graphic Design, Honors English 12, Trigonometry/Pre-Calculus, Welding 2. We partner with College Board, NWRESD, Portland Community College, Western Oregon University, and Tillamook Bay Community College to offer college credit for high school classes.

### CAREER & TECHNICAL EDUCATION

We offer two strands of Career and Technical Education. In each strand students can take several courses for high school and college credit: -Applied Arts: Intro to Multimedia, Graphic Design, Film & Video, Media Arts, and Design Seminar -Agriculture/Manufacturing: Intro to Agriculture, Welding, Metal Fabrication, Agricultural Technology, Horticulture, Veterinary Science, Supervised Agricultural Experience, Agricultural Business Management.


