Video Cameras on Transportation Vehicles

The Board, as a part of the district's ongoing program to improve student discipline and ensure the health, welfare and safety of all those riding school transportation vehicles, may utilize video cameras on any school vehicles transporting students to and from curricular and extracurricular activities.

Video cameras may be used to monitor student behavior on school transportation vehicles transporting students to and from curricular and extracurricular activities.

Such equipment may also be used to monitor the performance of transportation employees in the fulfillment of their duties on school transportation vehicles transporting students to and from curricular and extracurricular activities.

Students in violation of district conduct rules shall be subject to disciplinary action in accordance with established Board policy and administrative regulations governing student conduct and discipline.

Staff shall be subject to established Board personnel policies, administrative regulations and collective bargaining agreements including provisions related to evaluation, discipline and dismissal.

The superintendent is directed to develop administrative regulations governing the use of video cameras in accordance with the provisions of law and established Board policies and procedures.
