

MEMORIALS

The District supports appropriate memorials to students or other persons having special significance or having made meaningful contributions to the school community.

The memorial shall be of no cost to the District. Items received as memorials become the property of the District. Principals must have the Superintendent's prior approval for any request to establish a memorial or to accept any item that may require additional maintenance cost to the District. The Superintendent may establish guidelines for the acceptance of such memorials. The District shall exert reasonable efforts to maintain said memorials.

Examples of memorials may include, but are not limited to:

1. A bench with plaque with individual's name
2. A living memorial with a plaque in the media center. Funds go toward the purchase of books for the media center
3. A plaque placed on an art piece, i.e., a sculpture
4. A living memorial, which funds go toward a scholarship
5. A score board with the individual's name
6. A plaque at the base of a flag pole
7. A plaque on bleachers, "in memory of"
8. A plaque on the backstop, "in memory of"
9. A memorial page in the school yearbook
10. An annual award using the individual's name for an attribute, such as good sportsmanship, leadership, etc.
11. Planting a tree
